## Commitment & Expectations

### **Mentors commit to:**

- Completing a Mentor Training Session.
- Attending in the 10 program sessions, including the Meet & Greet, Midpoint Check-In, and graduation.
- Assisting their mentee with two job shadowing placements. We have resources to help!
- Completing the self-assessment or reviewing past assessment results prior to the first session in order to understand how they relate to their mentee.
- Completing a mid-point and post-program evaluation.

### **Mentors are required to:**

- Submit their completed PA Criminal Background Check, PA Child Abuse History, and Disclosure Statement or FBI Federal Criminal History Background Check and Fingerprinting check. Detailed instructions provided.
- Remain present and engaged at program sessions and encourage mentees to do the same.
- Communicate in a timely manner to Chamber staff and liaisons, regarding program participation, planned or unplanned absences, and the job shadowing process.
